Oceans: Surface/ Below

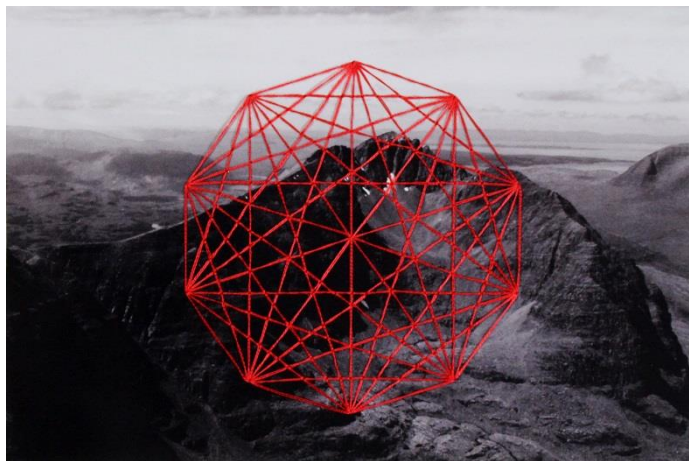
